

**COVID Guidelines - January 2022**

<p align="center"><b>School Environment Direct Contacts - Unvaccinated Persons</b>                      Contact was made within the school environment</p>	
Quarantine only	Quarantine for 10 days with day 1 being the day after the last day of exposure to the positive testing person
Quarantine plus masking	Quarantine for 5 days with day 1 being the day after the last day of exposure to the positive testing person <i>plus</i> Mask days 6-10 <b>required</b>
Quarantine and test on day 5	Quarantine for 7 days with day 1 being the day after the last day of exposure to the positive testing person <b>and</b> on day 5 test negative (returning to school on day 8). Wearing a mask around others for 10 days is <b>recommended</b> .
Remain in school by testing plus masking	Remain in school by testing negative on days 2, 4, and 6 <i>plus</i> Mask days 1-10 <b>required</b>
Remain in school by testing only	Remain in school by testing negative on days 1 through 7 with day one being the day after the last day of exposure to the positive testing person and wearing a mask around others for 10 days are <b>recommended</b> .

<p align="center"><b>School Environment Direct Contacts - Vaccinated Persons</b>                      Contact was made within the school environment</p>	
No quarantine is required. However, The CDC recommends that a mask be worn when near others for 10 days following the date of exposure to the positive testing person with day one being the day after the last day of exposure to the positive testing person	

<p align="center"><b>NOT in the School Environment Direct Contacts - Unvaccinated Persons</b>                      Contact was made outside the school environment ( in the home or community)</p>	
Quarantine for 5 days with day 1 being the day after the last day of exposure to the positive testing person <i>plus</i> Mask days 6-10 <b>required</b>	

<p align="center"><b>Positive Testing Persons - Unvaccinated and Vaccinated Persons</b></p>	
May return to school/ work if:	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● At least 5 days have passed since symptom onset <i>plus</i> Mask days 6-10 <b>required</b></li> <li>● At least 24 hours have passed since resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications</li> </ul> <p>AND</p>	

- Other symptoms have improved (Lost of taste and smell may last for weeks or months and need not delay the end of isolation)

Please note that there is no testing requirement to return to school

### Direct Contacts - Quarantine Not Required

Students or staff who have tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 90 days.

Students 5-17 years of age who are two or more weeks past completion of a primary series of COVID-19 vaccine. Testing on day 5 and wearing a mask around others for 10 days are recommended.

Students and staff 18 years of age or older who have received all recommended COVID-19 vaccine doses, including a booster dose. There is no time requirement following administration of the booster dose. Testing on day 5 and wearing a mask around others for 10 days are recommended.

We are offering a free COVID testing clinic at Fraser High School, 34270 Garfield (come to the Athletics Entrance on the north end of the school) **for students exposed at school**. It is open weekdays from **7:00 – 10:30 a.m.** No appointment is necessary, but please parents need to complete the [consent form](#) prior to coming for testing. We are using rapid tests, results are sent via email.

Staff and students should always monitor for fever, cough, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, runny or stuffy nose, loss of taste or smell, and abdominal pain.
