The parking permit fee is **\$40.00** per year and is **non-refundable**. This permit is transferable to a second car only if it is registered on this form. **The permit MUST BE DISPLAYED ON MIRROR**. Any permit that is lost or stolen must be replaced at a cost of **\$50.00**. There will be a 5-day waiting period before a replacement permit is issued.

DRIVING AND PARKING LOT RULES

- FHS Students applying for a parking permit must be cleared of any school fines <u>before</u> being issued a parking permit. You may wish to contact the office to resolve this matter.
- Seniors must have completed all parts of the state testing cycle in order to qualify for a permit. Permit holders may lose their parking privileges if they do not take all of the **MME** test scheduled this school year.
- Only **10th**, **11th** & **12th** grade students, with valid permits, may use the school's parking lots. If you were mistakenly given a permit, and it is discovered, the privilege will be rescinded.
- Students shall not use any parking spaces designated for special purposes or for the school staff.
- All vehicles must be properly parked and within spaces marked on the lots.
- Students must obey all rules for driving safety as established by the State of Michigan and Fraser High School. Violations include reckless, careless or negligent driving that demonstrates a disregard for the safety of persons or property.
- Students may not transfer (i.e. loan, lend, share or sell) their permits to other students
- Students may not park in school lots without a posted valid FHS permit. Violators may be ticketed or towed.
- Students who violate these parking rules may have their permit suspended or revoked and face the possibility of disciplinary action (suspension from school) by the school's administrator.

In connection with my request to park my vehicle on school property, I do agree that when there is "reasonable suspicion", to consent to the unlocking, opening and inspecting of my vehicle and all portions thereof including the trunk and engine area. The principal or his/her representative may undertake such examination of the vehicle or its contents. I agree to make any and all keys available to the principal or representative for this purpose. A student's refusal to cooperate may result in the revocation of the parking permit.

It is also understood that Fraser Public Schools have no specific responsibility for any vandalism or damage to private property or personal injury via the parking lots. All accidents, etc. fall under the jurisdiction of the Fraser Public Safety Department. If you vehicle is damaged in the parking lot, report the accident to the office <u>AND</u> the Fraser Police.
